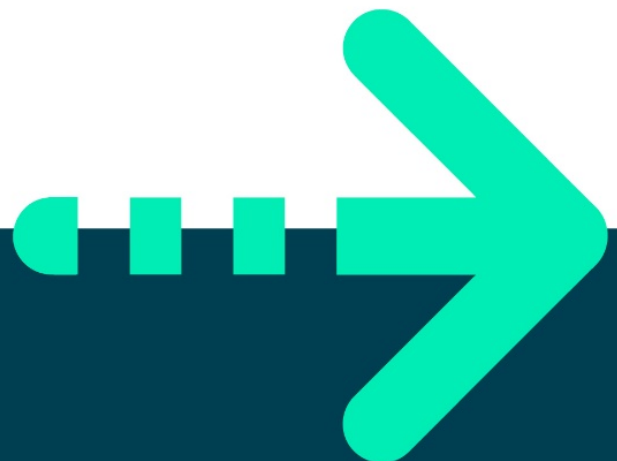




# Display the current time from an Atomic Clock





# Display the current time from an Atomic Clock

**The whole exercise should be done over three days – three stages**

## Requirements

Display the local regional atomic time. This is the time retrieved from an Atomic Clock server for the region that you live in.

The time should be displayed in the following format “<day> <month> <year> <hh:mm:ss>”. It should be in a font and style that makes it very noticeable.

The time must be retrieved from a time server – recommended server location <https://www.ntppool.org/en/>. Time servers that can be reached easily are at <https://www.pool.ntp.org/zone/europe>, and <http://www.ntp.org/>.

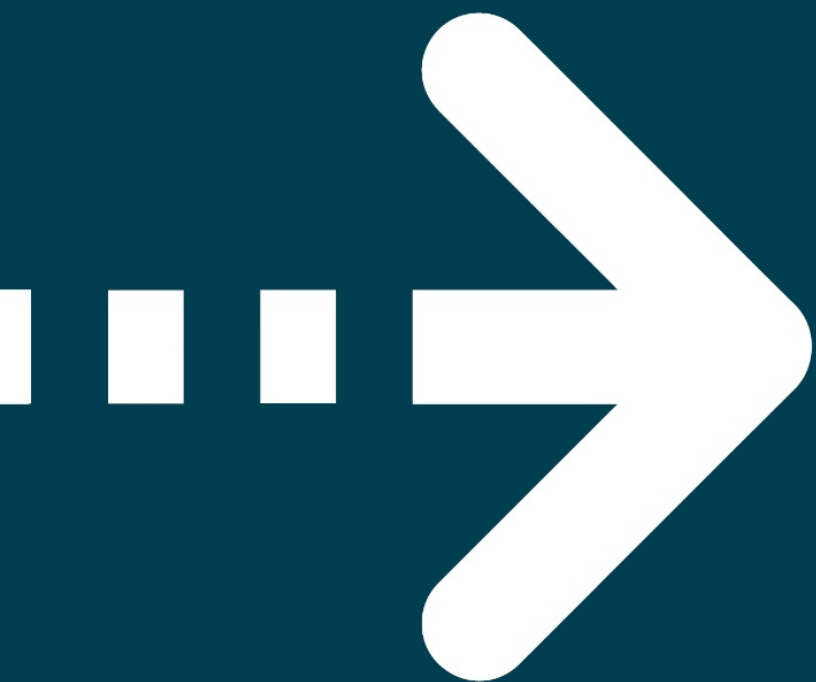
## Stage 1 – time to complete 4 hours

### Requirements

Display the local Atomic time. The time should be displayed in the following format “<day> <month> <year> <hh:mm:ss>”.

Date and time should be displayed on a web page. Web page should have a company logo. The purpose of the site is to act as a front to other services such as product listings, account details, orders, online purchase system etc. These other features should be accessible from the Web site after login. The home page should have a login button, when selected the user should be logged into the system (a conceptual system – nothing really there), and the web page should display the date and time of the last login. On a first time login, no last login details should be given.
