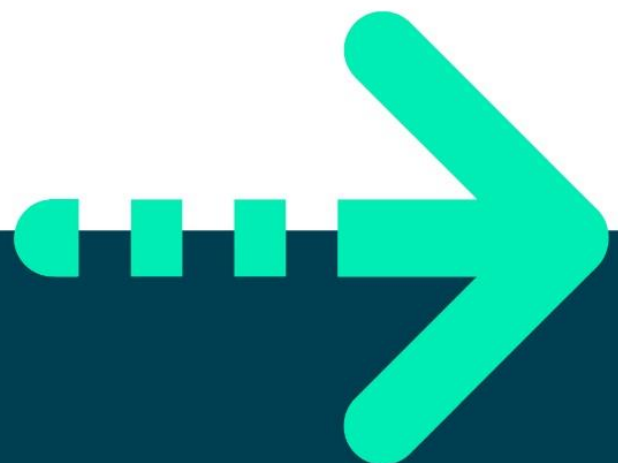




Digital by Design (DxD) Technical Specification Guide

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1. About this guide

Level 3 Digital Marketing is one of QA's portfolio of digital-by-design (DxD) apprenticeships.

To help prepare and support you for digital learning, this guide outlines the different technologies used to deliver our apprenticeship, with guidance on what you need to do to ensure you can access them as and when you need to during your programme.

Use this document to ensure everything works correctly on your device. If you experience any issues, please flag it to your IT department.

2. Technical requirements

1. Internet connectivity
2. Internet browser
3. Webcam
4. Enabled microphone (laptop/desktop)

As part of the digital journey, our apprenticeships require you to connect with key contacts such as your Digital Learning Consultant (DLC), via web conferencing.

3. Key technologies and digital platforms
